Onto happier things now, and the line up for the Hops in 2024 is taking shape nicely....

North West Counties Hop 1-3 March 2024

Prebooking is already open for those who want coach and hotel, and is already oversubscribed. This isn't necessarily a bad thing, if we can get the numbers to make a second coach pay its way, then I have plenty of hotel rooms available (we're staying in Blackpool!). IF we can get a second coach, then I'll bring it from Cardiff, giving extra pick up points in the West Country and Birmingham (the first coach starts at East Midlands Parkway and goes via Crewe). If you wish to reserve the full trip then get in touch quickly. I expect this trip to be on open sale very shortly.

Easter and April

Easter is one of Phil's Hops in the SWPL. His details are out, and if you haven't seen them, they are attached with this email, including a revised booking form that looks suspiciously like I've seen it before! There may be time for an additional trip before the season is out (Hellenic League is favourite, with another up my sleeve!)

United Counties League, 26-28 July

Difficult to say exactly, but what we do know is that we'll be based in Nottingham University so will be looking at the Midlands. What I'd LIKE to do is below, but of course is subject to relegation, promotion, and sideways moves. IF it all works out, here's my **very** provisional draft:

Saturday: Lutterworth Athletic, GNG Oadby, Kirby Muxloe, Loughborough Students Sunday: Harrowby United, Asfordby

Also in the frame: Rugby Borough, Racing Club Warwick, Coventry United, Daventry Town, Lincoln United

Still "to do": Newport Pagnell, March Town United, Histon, Godmanchester, Eynesbury, St Neots (looks like a decent 2025 line up there!)

In addition, 2024 marks 20 years since the famous CML "five in a day", so under the twenty year rule, Kimberley, Dunkirk and Sandiacre could all be back under consideration.....

Wales 2024 (Part 1)

IF we can get the FAW to amend the dates of the cup competitions, then we will be back for 2024. If we can't, then that will be that for our flagship – and longest running – hop. Should that happen, we'll look for a Step 7 league in England that wants to do a hop (we can't go Steps 5/6 because it will also be FA Vase weekend). There's one obvious candidate that we already have a tentative agreement with and would be very popular.....if we can get rid of their hostility towards Sunday games! Mind you, August is before most Sunday football starts so that should keep them happy....

If we can agree things, then the aim is to be back in Gwent.

Wales 2024 (Part 2) 20-22 September

Heading for West Wales for the second year with the new League and provisionally we have this: Friday September 20 Game in the Ardal under lights

Saturday September 21 Ynystawe Athletic – Clydach – AFC Glais

Sunday September 22 West End – Giants Grave

Again, all subject to promotion and relegation, some interesting names have applied for promotion to the League, and there's the possibility of Morriston Town coming down (in which case they would be on the weekend for sure).

One other word of news is that the League are ruling out 3G cages which have no spectator access from next season. That affects Evans & Williams (planning to share at Stebonheath Park if promoted) and Rockspur (looking to move anyway, possibly to Llandarcy Park)

SCEFL, 4-6 October

No provisional line up yet, although London has been mentioned.....

Southern Combination, 25-27 October

Most of the away clubs from the 2023 Hop will be the host clubs for this year. What we already know is that Pagham v Steyning will be the Friday evening game (as long as both are in the same division!), this is the match that was washed out on Saturday morning.

Crowborough Town, Jarvis Brook, Roffey, Oakwood, East Preston should be the other five, but again, subject to movement.

One other thing to consider is that this may move to 6-8 September, I'll be talking to the League about this. Watch this space!

Still in the pipeline:

European trip – possibly to warmer climes or more likely to somewhere that has a Summer season. The Baltic countries look favourite for that.

Craig's Grand Days Out – distance defeated us for The Stanks, but a bit of planning and preparation for a long day and we can do it. Accommodation is horrendously expensive in Berwick, and this may be more than a day trip to make it work. Watch this space! Similarly, we can go to Fort William, but be prepared for a three day trip for one match. Maybe we'll start things slightly easier....!!

Guernsey and/or Jersey by FastCat from Poole, with collection points en route – let's see what the fixtures and Condor Ferries timetables bring! At a first glance, there's a day trip opportunity in April BUT it's a bit tight on times. There's some February options that involve a night over on Guernsey which may appeal, but for those who would rather fly flights are not cheap (twice that of the most expensive sea crossing)

The "Football Holiday" – this is an idea that works as a six-day break watching matches at all levels in a particular area. We'll just go to games that are scheduled at all levels, so a trip for those who will do football wherever and whenever they can! It's still a rough outline at the moment, but also offers the chance to visit other attractions such as the National Football Museum or Stadium tours to make it a brilliant week!

The former grounds tour – a weekend that visits locations of former grounds. South Wales for the Vetch, Ninian, Somerton, Aberdare Athletic and the Mushrooms of Mid-Rhondda! North for Peel Park (Accrington), Nelson, Bradford Park Avenue, Huddersfield. Keep an eye open for this one!
